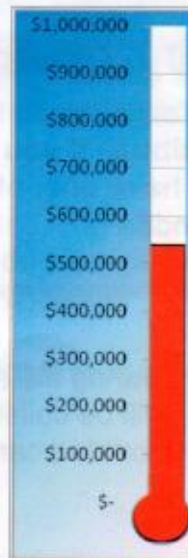

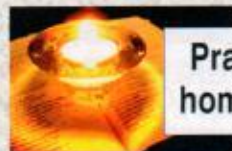

QUICK GRASP OF CATHOLIC FAITH: CANON LAW

LITURGY OF THE WORD: The Church fulfills its sanctifying function in a special way through the liturgy. In the liturgy, the Mystical Body of Christ, head and members, offers public worship to God. This worship occurs when it is carried out in the name of the Church, by persons appointed, and through acts approved by Church authority. The **FIRST READING** is always found in the Old Testament. "We sit and listen to the word of God as it was spoken through his prophets and apostles. The Reader takes their place in speaking to us. At the end of the reading: **READER SAY:** The word of the Lord. **PEOPLE SAY: THANKS BE TO GOD.**

EDUCATIONAL CORNER

FIRST READING: This passage from Isaiah constitutes the First Reading at the Mass of the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. The people from afar who brought gifts to the new city are a type of the Magi, the wise men or astrologers from the East, who traveled to bring gifts to the infant Christ after his Birth. This reading also extols and praises the beauty of the restored city of Jerusalem. (CCC 716)

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: The king of Israel was responsible for imparting justice in his realm. In practice, many of the kings of Israel failed seriously in this regard. With the loss of population through exile combined with the loss of the Davidic monarchy, the hope for future justice became invested in the Messiah, the perfect king foretold by the prophets. Justice and peace would be one of the chief features of the Messiah's reign, especially in light of its emphasis on the love and care for the poor and afflicted.

SECOND READING: Paul, the Apostle to the Gentiles, was sent by Christ to preach to the uncircumcised, those who were not of the Jewish faith, although not exclusively. He revealed to them the "mystery of Christ" from which promises of hope derived from the Son of God made man. (CCC 424-425,772,2778)

GOSPEL: The identity of Jesus as the Christ, the Son of God, was revealed in stages; first to Mary and Joseph, then to shepherds and then to the Magi, and later to John the Baptist and then to the disciples. The mission of the Church is to make Christ known to all nations. The shepherds were the poor and ignorant and the Magi represented the pagan believers and intellectuals. All are called to share in the gift of salvation in Christ's Kingdom by receiving the Good News and recognizing Jesus as the Christ, the Son of God and the king of all nations. (CCC 430,528,724)
