



QUICK GRASP OF CATHOLIC FAITH: CANON LAW

Continue of the Liturgy: Since Lent is almost upon us, just a note about the "Gloria", it is usually sung after the invocation EXCEPT on Sundays of Advent, Ash Wednesday and Sundays of Lent. The priest will then read the "Collect". This is when the Priest expresses the theme of the day's celebration and petitions God the Father through the meditation of Christ in the Holy Spirit. The people pray silently then the Priest will read the Collect. We discussed the reading of the Old Testament and after that comes "the Responsorial Psalm" (of which 75 of the I50 Psalms were written by King David.) The people repeat the RESPONSE sung by a cantor after the first time and then after each verse. Remember, Jesus Christ is truly present with us at the Altar. We can't emphasize enough of the importance of the congregation's full participation during the entire Mass...in communion with the angels and the saints...we should never fail to respond in a loud voice when we are asked to respond especially during the Responsorial Psalms; and we also encourage for all to sing along with the choir.

EDUCATIONAL CORNER


FIRST READING: The time frame for this reading in Isaiah is written about a century after the first part of the Book of Isaiah. It is long after Hezekiah's reign ended, and

the threat of deportation to Babylon had taken place. This section intends to provide consolation to the exiles who would return to Judah to restore Jerusalem and its Temple. The ultimate consolation rests in the coming of the Messiah, who would bring salvation to the whole world. Please note that verse 3 reveals a prophecy concerning St. John the Baptist, the last prophet and the precursor of Christ. He announced the arrival of the Messiah and \ identified Jesus as such at the River Jordon. These verses are usually read for the First Reading at Mass on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. (CCC 754, 719).

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: This wonderful hymn is all about the praises of God for the marvels of creation through which he reveals himself to his people. Not only is creation an indescribable marvel but also God explicitly entrusted the world to every person. The Lord created the world in such a way that, through human work. every person can secure sustenance, shelter, and protection. Creation not only stops at just providing needs but also serves as material elements such as bread, wine, and oil for the administration of Sacraments. (CCC 288,295,703,1333)

SECOND READING: Titus wrote this Epistle between AD 63 and 66. Titus was a disciple who went with St. Paul to Crete and helped organize the church there and to appoint elders or presbyters (priests) to manage its various communities as they were formed. He stressed that the grace obtained by Christ's Redemption brings us into a new life in Christ and assists us to grow in holiness. Grace merited by Christ brings about a participation in the divine life manifested by the infused theological virtues and the moral virtues. (CCC 2, 802,868-870)

GOSPEL: St. Luke tells us the story of the preaching of John the Baptist. John the Baptist was the prophet "crying in the wilderness". foretold in Isaiah, who urged the people to "prepare the way of the Lord". He called everyone to repentance before the imminent appearance of the Savior since rejection of sin is the indispensable condition to have a relationship with Christ. (CCC 535)
