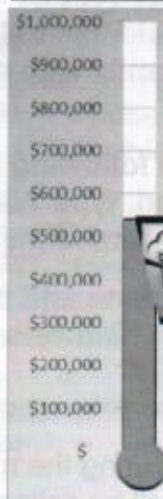

QUICK GRASP OF CATHOLIC FAITH: CANON LAW

Continuation of Liturgy: We have previously discussed the First Reading from the Old Testament, the Responsorial Psalms from the Old Testament and today we will be thinking about the **SECOND READING** from the New Testament including all letters and writings EXCEPT FOR THE FOUR GOSPELS. The people will be sitting during this reading and will respond "Thanks be to God". Then **ALL STAND FOR THE GOSPEL ACCLAMATION**. This shows our respect for the Gospels. The people repeat the alleluia after the cantor's alleluia and then after each verse. The Gospels contain the actual story of the life of Christ and the reading of the Gospel is especially solemn. The reading itself is done only by a Bishop, Priest, or Deacon. A special gesture is done by all— signing our forehead, lips, and heart with the sign of the cross. We trace the sign of the cross on our forehead, lips, and heart as we say inaudibly, "May the Lord purify my understanding, my speech, and my heart, so that I may receive the words of the Gospel". This outward sign is meant to help us focus on the **WORDS OF OUR SAVIOR** that we hear in the Gospel. **COME AND ENJOY MASS AND REMEMBER THE SPECIAL GESTURES BEFORE THE GOSPEL.**

EDUCATIONAL CORNER



FIRST READING: Isaiah Chapter 62 tells of the vindication and salvation of Zion. Speaking to Jerusalem directly, this prophecy compares again God's love to parental and spousal love. God's love, in many instances, is compared to the love of a bridegroom for his bride. God, through his prophet, urged his people to be vigilant in preparation for the last day. (CCC 219 ,1611)

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: This Psalm shows adoration and praise which is the proper response to the infinite goodness of God. The tenets of the Faith should lead us to praise and give thanks. This Psalm addresses the mighty works of God with the evil of idolatry. Church Tradition states that our prayer forms our beliefs and this is why the liturgy remains the key means by which the Church catechizes the faithful. This Psalm shows great joy that the Lord has come among his people. (CCC 1021, 1697-1698)

SECOND READING: St. Paul is telling the Corinthians that ecstatic and charismatic activity was common in early Christian experience. He also told them that there is an experience of the Spirit and an understanding of ecstatic phenomena that is specifically Christian and that is different from those of the pagans. Every good thing we have comes from God. To use our gifts and talents for the good of others is to allow God to work through us. (CCC 249,308)

GOSPEL: At the request of His mother, Mary, Christ worked his first miracle at the Wedding Feast at Cana. The wedding feast prefigures the eternal wedding banquet of the Lamb in Heaven in which there will be a perfect and blissful union between Christ and every member of his Mystical Body, the Church. (CCC967-975, 1613,2618)
