



Soon he was called upon by the Church to settle disputes, attend synods, and fight abuses. With his many writings, he encouraged others to restore discipline to their lives. In 1828, he was declared a Doctor of the Church.

QUICK GRASP OF CATHOLIC FAITH: CANON LAW

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST: After the Liturgy of the Word, in which we hear God's word and learn about him, comes the Liturgy of the Eucharist, in which we receive Communion and meet God bodily. We are all sitting and wondering "What is the Lord asking of me?" We all have a mind and a body, and this part of the Mass makes God real to us in a way that the mind alone could ignore or dismiss. The Eucharist goes beyond hearing and understanding the word and completes it in a way that the whole person (body as well as mind) is engaged and drawn to God. We now have the "Preparation of the Gifts". The altar is prepared with a corporal, purificator, chalice and missal. At the same time, a collection is taken among the congregation, and the gifts of bread and wine are prepared to be brought forth by families in the congregation. It is an honor to take the gifts up to the Priest. COME TO MASS AND ENJOY THE PRIVILEGE OF HEARING AND PARTICIPATING IN THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST.

EDUCATIONAL CORNER

FIRST READING: Our first reading is found in Genesis and God's first covenant with Abram. God promised Abram that many descendants would come from him. He would

Become the father of the Chosen People and eventually of the Christian family. Abram's prayer reflects his struggle in faith amid a trust in God's faithful providence. He pleads not in despair but petitions, not only for himself but for future generations. Abram's faith, even in the face of being childless, was unwavering. In the New Testament, Paul would teach that all believers are children of Abraham. (CCC 59-61,146, 762)

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: This triumphant song of confidence was written by King David. He describes his turmoil and trials of his life but states that these troubles are counteracted by God's strength and protection expressed as light. God is our light that overcomes all obstacles and at the same time bestows salvation. Our late Pope John Paul II wrote "Communion with God is a source of serenity, joy and tranquility: it is like reaching an oasis of light and love". (CCC 2730)

SECOND READING: This book was written to the Philippians during St. Paul's imprisonment in Rome about AD 61-62. It was written to the predominantly Gentile located in Macedonia in northern Greece. His letter was one of thanksgiving and encouragement to a thriving Christian community. Paul stresses to the Gentiles that growing in holiness always involves our cooperation with grace and a correspondence to grace through an ongoing struggle. Our eyes must be fixed on the prize, which is eternal life. (CCC 824,827, 1030,1054)

GOSPEL: The Transfiguration allowed his closest disciples to see his glorified countenance. This spectacular manifestation of Christ's divinity strengthened their faith. As at his baptism, this episode occasioned a manifestation of the blessed trinity. It also affirmed Christ's fulfillment of the Law and prophets by showing him with Moses, the lawgiver, and Elijah, the greatest of the Old Testament prophets. (CCC516, 554, 1151, 2583, 2600)
