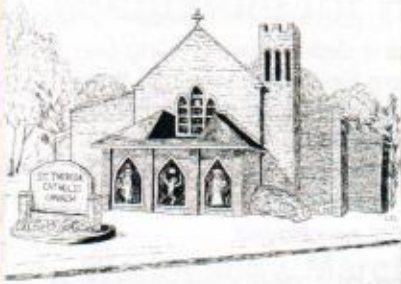

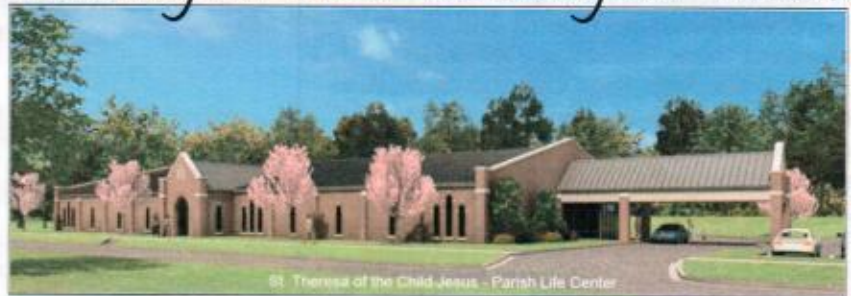

**Our saint of the week is: St. Joseph** His Feast Day is March 19th. A few verses in Matthew and Luke tell us all we need to know about St. Joseph. They tell us why he was the divine choice to become the husband of Mary & the foster father of Jesus. Because he was a *descendant of King David*, he gave Christ his *royal lineage*. He came from *Bethlehem*, the city that Scripture predicted would *produce the messiah* (Micah 5:1). And as a carpenter (Matthew 13:55), Joseph was *poor--Christ's condition of preference*. Joseph's wise, dealings with Mary is a model for all of us. He subordinated his feelings to do God's will. He was open to whatever God wanted, and when he sensed the divine will, he obeyed.

**Our Scripture of the week is: Romans 22:19** Then he took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Luke 22:19

**QUICK GRASP OF CATHOLIC FAITH: CANON LAW**

**THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST Continued:** As we leave the many prayers of the Preface, we come to the COMMUNION RITE. To prepare for the Paschal meal, to welcome the LORD, we pray for forgiveness and exchange a sign of peace to one another. Before eating CHRIST'S Body and drinking his Blood, we must be one with Him and with all our brothers and sisters in the Church. All people stand, the Priest will ask us to say what Jesus taught us "The Our Father..." The Church is a community of Christians joined by the Spirit in love. It needs to express and restore its peaceful unity before eating the one Body of the Lord and drink from the one cup of salvation. The Priest says the prayer of peace and then asks the people to exchange a sign of peach with each other. CANON LAW #918 states that it is highly recommended that the faithful receive Holy Communion during the celebration of the Eucharist itself.

**EDUCATIONAL CORNER**

**PALM SUNDAY--** On this day, the Church celebrates Christ's entrance into Jerusalem to accomplish the Paschal Mystery of his death and resurrection.

**FIRST READING:** Our reading is from the Prophet Isaiah. It is a poem that describes the servant as embracing God's will. This identification with God's will would bring much suffering upon this servant. The anguish and suffering would lead to the redemption of the whole human race. These prophetic words describe in great detail the humiliation and pain of the suffering Messiah. These words are always read as the first reading at Mass on Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, the first day of Holy Week. (CCC 134-141)

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM:** This very sad lament is true in prophetic references to Christ's Passion and Death on the Cross. Some phrases are explicitly cited in the New Testament. Example is "My God...forsaken me?" This opening verse was recited by Christ on the Cross. Christ took upon himself all of our sins and atoned for them on the Cross. This early Old Testament Psalm is a parallel to the Crucifixion of Christ. (CCC 112, 603, 716)

**SECOND READING:** This reading is from Paul explaining the Paschal Mystery to the Philippians. He is discussing their unity and humility. Christ willingly took on the role of a servant and allowed himself to be crucified for our sake even though he was innocent of any sin. Christ accepted this suffering knowingly and willingly because it was the will of his Father and out of love for us. It was through his obedience that our redemption was achieved. (CCC 411, 564, 612)

**GOSPEL:** Palm Sunday's Gospel begins with Jesus coming into Jerusalem for the Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread. In Luke's account of the Crucifixion, we find the ultimate example of love. Christ's Passion includes every virtue that we can emulate, especially in the face of suffering and adversity. While He processed to the site of his Crucifixion and Death, He nevertheless took time to comfort others, to forgive his persecutors, to pray, to announce salvation to the repentant thief, and to commend himself to the hands of the Father. A crowd of onlookers and even the Roman centurion were moved to repentance and faith in his divinity as a result. (CCC 618)
