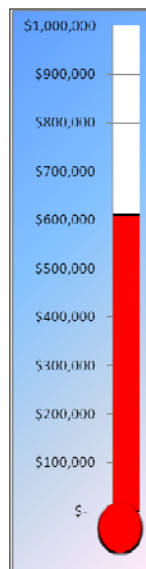

Saint of the Week:

St. George is thought to have been a soldier in the fourth century who courageously defended his faith and encouraged his fellow Christians. For this, he suffered martyrdom by beheading under Diocletian. He was a popular saint in the East. By the sixth century St. George had become an ideal Christian knight, and the legend of his slaying the dragon had become a familiar story. George's fame spread to Europe, where stained glass windows from the seventh and eighth centuries depicted this legend. The story tells of a dragon that terrorized the land and poisoned with its breath all who approached it. The dragon was fed sheep and then human beings chosen by lot. The day the king's daughter was to be served to the dragon, George came along. He slew the dragon and was offered anything he wanted for killing it. George refused any reward, but he made the king promise to build churches, honor priests, and show compassion to the poor. This act made George so popular that he came to reflect all the ideals of Christian chivalry. When the English king Richard I led his soldiers in the Crusades, he placed his army under George's protection. In one famous battle, the Christians were losing until, as the army leaders later insisted, St. George rode forward and led the troops to victory. From then on, George became the patron of England. King Edward III founded an order of knights under his patronage, and his feast was kept as a national festival. Although the stories of St. George may be untrue, no one can deny his real act of heroism: dying for Christ.

This is the third year that our students, entering grades 6 – 12 next school year, based on a set of criteria determined by the Finance Council, can apply for this scholarship. The scholarship is open to all registered youth of St. Theresa's parish.

We are awarding three scholarships of \$1,000.00. Application Forms can be obtained in the parish office. The completed application must be returned along with required Essays and Letter of Recommendation by June 26, 2016. Awards are for one year at a time, but previous winners may re-apply in following years.

EDUCATIONAL CORNER

FIRST READING: Paul's brutal stoning by the angry Jews did not deter him from returning to the city. The Apostles warned the new Christians that trials and persecution awaited them. However, it was through faithfulness among adversity that they could enter eternal life. Returning to Antioch in Syria, Paul and Barnabas rejoiced at the fruitfulness of their apostolic efforts. They gathered the Church together. The word "CHURCH" means "convocation" which means to "call together. The Greek word "presbyteros" is the source of the word "presbyter" which drives the word PRIEST. These holy men were given the authority to lead the Christian Community. (CCC 1554. 777)

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: This hymn written by King David is a litany of praise for God's many interventions in forming, guiding, and protecting his people throughout the course of history. God's vision for all people is to form a kingdom of grace, mercy, justice and love rather than of power and domination. His works of creation are magnificent, but his most striking attribute is his boundless MERCY toward us. God shares his goodness in a spectacular way by making the human person in his image and likeness. (CCC 295, 300, 342)

SECOND READING: The NEW Heaven is shown to John. All of Creation is renewed and the Bride of Christ--The Church, the New Jerusalem--is presented at the wedding feast of the Lamb. The New Jerusalem descends from the sky, a place of splendor and perfection where the blessed will behold God face to face in the Beatific Vision. These verses provide a glimpse of the state of eternal glory that will be enjoyed in HEAVEN. (CCC 770-771, 1044-1045, 1186,2016,2676)

GOSPEL: "THE PROMISE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT"One who loves CHRIST and keeps the Commandments will have the TRINITY dwelling within the soul through grace. For this reason, our bodies are called temples of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit would descend upon the Apostles at Pentecost, fifty days after Christ rose f from the dead. The teaching authority of the Church relies upon the Holy Spirit so the Gospel preached by Christ is taught according to the mind of Christ without any possibility of error to all generations. The Holy Spirit through the Church together make present Christ and his Sacrifice of redemption in the liturgy, particularly in the Sacrament of the HOLY EUCHARIST.
