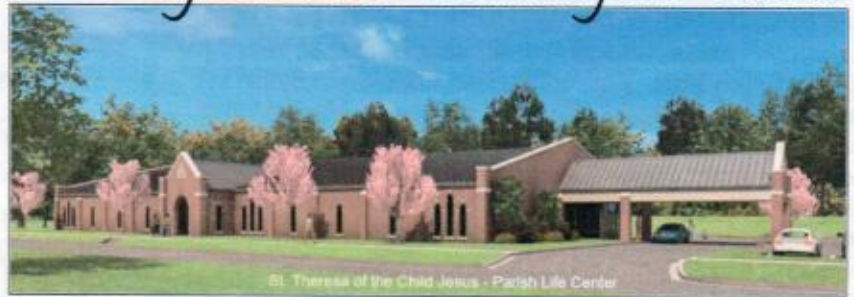

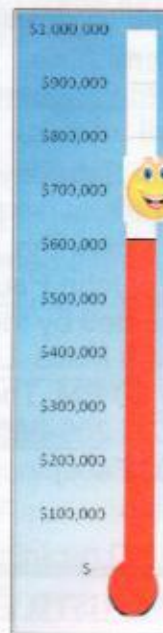

This is the third year that our students, entering grades 6 – 12 next school year, based on a set of criteria determined by the Finance Council, can apply for this scholarship. The scholarship is open to all registered youth of St. Theresa's parish.

## QUICK GRASP OF CATHOLIC FAITH: CANON LAW

The Names of "The Mass": Catholics call the celebration of the Lord's Supper a variety of names and seven titles come to mind:

1. THE EUCHARIST (a Greek term meaning "thanksgiving").
2. THE LITURGY (a word that means "work", literally the work of the Lord).
3. THE HOLY SACRIFICE (after both the sacrifice of Christ and that of the Faithful).
4. THE OFFERING (referring to Jesus' offering to the Father and to His disciples).
6. THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD (referring to what Jesus did at the Last Supper).
7. THE LORD'S SUPPER (referring to Jesus' institution of the Mass).
8. THE WEDDING BANQUET OF THE LORD (reflecting the Book of Revelation's term.)

## EDUCATIONAL CORNER

**FIRST READING:** At this time in the Church, the matter of "being circumcised" continued to be a challenge of the unconditional acceptance of Gentiles into the Church. Christianity was still regarded by some as a Jewish sect, and Jewish Law had always forbidden the uncircumcised from becoming part of the Jewish faith. Circumcision was seen as so necessary that in the Jewish mindset it was even vital for salvation. Paul and Barnabas visited Peter and the Apostles in Jerusalem to resolve the matter of Gentile circumcision and the application of the Mosaic Law. Peter, in his role as head of the Church, made the final decision and all the assembly kept silent. A letter was then written to all of the Church and everyone present accepted Peter's decision. The Gentiles would be asked to abstain from eating meat that had been sacrificed to idols, eating strangled animals, consuming animal blood, and impure sexual unions. These were the points applied to Jews and Gentiles alike. (CCC 595,879,877,185.1594,2034)

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM:** This beautiful song was written to be sung with string instruments. It was written by King David as PRAISE AND THANKSGIVING to the Choirmaster. It was written to reflect the hope that all people might come to worship the God of Israel. God is the source of all power and salvation.

**SECOND READING:** John's visions continue...One of the seven angels told John he would take him to see the new holy city, New Jerusalem. It came down out of Heaven and had a brilliant radiance of a rare jewel. The angel explained that we are all elevated to the status of a son or daughter of God. John noted that there was no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb, (CCC 460,1045,133,600)

**GOSPEL:** The Apostle John explains in his Gospel that Christ is known to the world but can only be known intimately by those who respond to him with love. One who loves Christ and keeps the Commandments will have the Trinity dwelling within the soul through grace. For this reason, our bodies are called temples of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit through the Church together make present Christ and his Sacrifice of redemption in the liturgy, particularly in the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.
