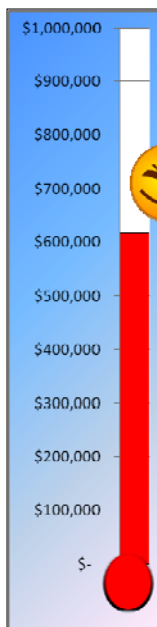

EDUCATIONAL CORNER

FIRST READING: In the Old Testament, Elijah speaks of the Widow of Zarephath. Elijah taught the widow at Zarephath about faith and trust in God's Word. The woman was short on food, but with Elijah's assurance her supply of flour and oil lasted miraculously for the duration of the drought. Her faith was further confirmed when her son died and Elijah's prayer raised him back to life. **OUR CATECHISM OF JESUS' CHURCH DEALS WITH THE PEOPLE THAT NEED EDUCATION IN FAITH AND CONVERSION OF HEART...CHECK OUT CCC 2581-2584.**

RESPONSORIAL: This is a song of praise written by King David and was sung apparently for the first Jewish feast of purification, which commemorated the reconsecration of the Temple in 146 BC. This psalm is one of thanksgiving for the Temple and implicitly for a recovery from illness. It is prayed after the Fourth Reading at the Mass of the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night. (CCC 2580)

SECOND READING: Once again, Paul had to defend his call as an Apostle. He recounted his persecution of the first Christians and mentioned his dramatic call in grace and his early contact with Cephas (Peter) the head of the Church. His purpose was to show that he, like the first Apostles, received his mission directly from Christ and that he was in communion with Peter, the head and teaching authority of the Church. (CCC 153, 442,659,861-863)

GOSPEL: Luke describes a story of a sinful woman being forgiven. Although she was a great sinner, the woman with the perfume won more praise for her act of love than did the dinner host Simon, a Pharisee who failed to provide Christ with the basic courtesy of hospitality common at that time. The passage shows that true faith is inspired by repentance and charity. The love and faith of the woman won her forgiveness. Her love was so much the greater given the Lord's forgiveness of her sins. This profound repentance is the necessary step in beginning a deep life of prayer. (CCC 575,588,1441,2616)

QUICK GRASP OF CATHOLIC FAITH: CANON LAW

HISTORY OF CHURCH RULES: The brief synopsis of the long history of canon law is divided into eight periods: a.) From the end of the first century to the late fourth century: The Post-apostolic and Early Church. b.) From the fourth to the eighth centuries: The Church of the Empire. c.) From the eighth to the twelfth centuries: The Church and Feudalism. d.) From the mid-twelfth to the mid-fourteenth centuries: The Classical Period. e.) From the mid-fourteenth to the eighteenth centuries: Decline and Reform. f.) From the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries: The Church in the Modern World. g.) The twentieth century until the Second Vatican Council: The Codification of Canon Law. h.) The end of the twentieth century and beginning of the twenty-first century: The Revised Code and the Struggle for Church Renewal. **THE RULE MAKING PROCESS IS STIMULATED IN PERIODS OF CHURCH REFORM. PRAY THAT WE MAKE THE RIGHT DECISIONS FOR GOD.**
