

# EDUCATIONAL CORNER

FIRST READING: In the Old Testament, 2 Samuel, God spoke to the Prophets on a regular basis. God gave the Prophet Nathan a message to be delivered to King David. Nathan was a great Prophet, like the Church today,

had the role of acting as the moral conscience for those in authority. Nathan spoke with David and told him of all the things that God had done for him. He continued his many sins until God had enough of his sinful actions. His sins were comparable to Adam's sins since he, like Adam, represented the first in a line of descendants, and through his actions, he brought the consequences of his sin to his descendants. Nathan explained that our merciful Lord had "put away his sins when he repented. He was punished by God with the death of his baby son that he had with Bathsheba. (CCC 1435, 1736, 2246, 2538)

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM**: This beautiful song was written by King David because of his joy of forgiveness. To confess one's requires humility expressed in self-knowledge and self-accusation. This virtue is crucial in taking full advantage of the Sacrament of Penance. God, who, as always, readily forgives the humble and contrite heart. (CCC 1502)

**SECOND READING**: In the Book of Galatians, we find Paul speaking to Gentiles and Jews together. The Church in Antioch was the first to be formed in which Jewish converts and Gentile converts worshiped together. The Laws of Moses was brought up many times between both groups. The New Law of Christ is based on love, grace and freedom; it perfects the Old Law, frees us from its ritual and juridical norms, and restores the original spirit of the divine law. (CCC 1972-please read to find out about this New Law and where it came from)

GOSPEL: WOMEN in the first century were considered "second class citizens" even the rich and famous ones. The story of the woman anointing Jesus' feet with an ointment and her tears gave Jesus much more love that his host, Simon, a Pharisee who failed to provide Christ with the basic courtesy of hospitality common at that time. The passage in the Scripture shows that true faith is inspired by repentance and charity. The love and faith of the woman won her forgiveness. The profound repentance is the necessary step in beginning of a deep life of prayer. Christ's larger group of disciples included WOMEN. Not only did they play an important role as Christ's followers but they were the first to announce his Resurrection, (CCC 575,588,1441,2616,641)

# QUICK GRASP OF CATHOLIC FAITH: CANON LAW

All churches have Consulting Bodies. We all go to Mass and not realize all of the wonderful Christians that work so hard behind the scene so that we all can worship God in all of His love and mercy. The Pastor of the Parish has many helpers as this is a large responsibility for only one person. All Churches have Consulting Bodies to help us. Currently, I can name five (5) of them. 1) Diocesan Synod; 2) Presbyteral Council; 3) College of Consultors; 4) Pastoral Council; 5) Finance Council. The two that we hear about the most are the Pastoral and Finance Council. Look on the front page of your Bulletin and you will see names of these good Christians.
