



# EDUCATIONAL CORNER

FIRST READING: ELIJAH, fearing for his life under Jezebel's threat to kill him fled to the wilderness in the land of Judah and prayed for a natural death. He was hiding in a cave and God spoke to him and said "What are you doing here, Elijah?" He told God all of the evil things that the sons of Israel had done and now they were seeking his life also. God told him to go to Damascus and eventually he would find Elisha, the son of Shaphat and you shall anoint him to be prophet in your place. Elisha left his home, family and belongings and went after Elijah, and ministered to him. (CCC 436, 2583).

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: This beautiful song was written by David to be read loudly in the temple. He tells us that God is infinite goodness and, therefore, the source of everlasting life and of all that is good. This psalm closes with a commitment to perseverance, remaining close to the Lord so as to enjoy always the joy and goodness that only God can provide. He refers to "His Body and netherworld, which is a prophetic reference to Christ, who was not left in Sheol but was raised from the dead on the third day. The Church teaches that during those three days, Christ preached the news of salvation to the just who had died before him; this is referenced in the Apostles' Creed. (CCC 627)

**SECOND READING**: Paul refers to the Law of the Old Covenant contrasted with the freedom of the New Covenant in Christ. Christ came not to abolish the Law but to fulfill it. The Old Law was a preparation for Christ's teachings on holiness through a profound love of God and neighbor. Aided with God's grace, the Commandments give u self-mastery over selfish tendencies and desires so we can be able to give ourselves completely t God and to lay down our lives for others. (CCC 1454, 1740-1742)

GOSPEL: This short Gospel explains that to truly follow Christ requires total commitment and a detachment from things of this world. While all Christians are called to imitate Christ completely, some are invited to embrace his life through the evangelical counsels of poverty, chastity, and obedience. (CCC 544, 914-916)

# QUICK GRASP OF CATHOLIC FAITH: CANON LAW

"THE SANCTIFYING FUNCTIONS OF OUR FAITH" To sanctify means to make holy, and to glorify the Holy One. The Church's work of sanctification is focused on its public acts of worship of God, the sacred liturgy and certain other penitential practices. The book of Canon Law is concerned with the regulations of the Church's divine worship. There are many canons/rules (325 of them) on the sacraments because the sacraments are the principal elements of Roman Catholic worship, and because various abuses in the past have generated a lot of regulations. We have seven (7) major Sacraments. 1)Baptism; 2)Confirmation; 3)Eucharist; 4)Penance; 5) Anointing of the Sick; 6)Orders; 7)Marriage We should all be able to name these seven Sacraments and understand the rules governing each one of them. Next week we will start with BAPTISM, MAY THE HOLY SPIRIT BE WITH YOU.
