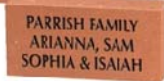
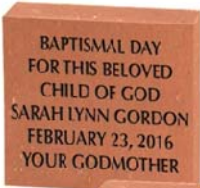

Many have been convinced by the popular culture that their only options are either to live in isolation and shame, or to publicly embrace the “gay lifestyle”, which places them in opposition to the teaching and care that our Church lovingly offers to them. There is another way; one that welcomes these precious souls into the life of the Church, and accompanies them in that life.

Courage is an international apostolate of the Catholic Church, which ministers to persons with same-sex attractions. Courage is unswerving in its faithfulness to the teachings of the Church on matters of human sexuality, while at the same time recognizing that the sacramental life, and the mutual support of chaste friendship are essential to the fullness of life that our Lord promised to us.

The Diocese of Birmingham has a Courage chapter that has regular meetings at several locations. Membership in Courage is held in the strictest confidence, as are the meeting places and times.

EDUCATIONAL CORNER

FIRST READING: Jeremiah lived in Jerusalem, where he was called by God to be a prophet in the 13th year of the reign of King Josiah, 627 BC. These events of Chapter 38 were thought to occur while Judah was under siege from Babylon. Jeremiah visited his hometown and was then accused of consorting with the enemy. He was beaten and imprisoned and interrogated by the king but did not back down on his prophecy. Jeremiah was casted into a cistern but was saved by the Ethiopian official Ebed-melech. He was interrogated by Zedekiah again. Jeremiah restated that the king should surrender to the Babylonians; if he did, he would be treated better and Jerusalem would be spared. Jeremiah lived in a time when the world had gone wrong and turned upside down. He said true to God's word through his life facing many obstacles.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: This song was written by King David. The hope of the Jewish People was for a messiah who would liberate them from the oppression of their enemies. The Holy Spirit inspires us to pray with the firm hope that our patient prayer will lead us to the true joy of knowing Christ. Jesus the Messiah has already won our salvation and now we joyfully await his Second Coming. (CCC 150,462,2657,2824)

SECOND READING: Christ presents the ultimate example of patience and persevering fidelity to the will of his Father through his sufferings and Death on the Cross. He traveled to Jerusalem willingly, knowing that he would be arrested and crucified. In our present condition, suffering and struggle are inevitable, and temptation and difficulties will always accompany us. With prayer and the grace of Christ, we can overcome these obstacles and grow in holiness. (CCC 569,598).

GOSPEL: In Scripture, fire symbolizes God's presence, his love, his judgment, divine purification, and the power of the Holy Spirit to effect change within us; in this passage, the word carries all of these meanings in various degrees. God offers us his love, mercy and salvation and ardently desires that we accept and respond to these gifts. (CCC 696)

QUICK GRASP OF CATHOLIC FAITH: CANON LAW

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK: (Can. 998-1007)
The Sacrament of Anointing, the Church commends to the suffering and glorified Lord the faithful who are seriously ill, so that he might alleviate their suffering and save them. This Sacrament is conferred by anointing with oil accompanied by the words of the ritual. This Sacrament was formally known as "extreme unction" or "last anointing". It is based on the passage in the Letter of James, 5:14-15: "Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the Church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord." Only a PRIEST validly administers the anointing of the sick. This Sacrament is to be administered when there is a doubt whether the sick person has attained the use of reason, whether the person is dangerously ill, or whether the person is dead.
