


Back by popular demand!!

EDUCATIONAL CORNER

FIRST READING: The Book of Isaiah is the first and longest book among the major prophets of the Old

Testament. The third part of the Book makes reference to the end of the Exile and proclaims the coming of salvation from God. The Jews that had returned to Judah found a difficult life form of extreme hardships, obstacles, and chaos, which threatened to destroy their hope of a successful restoration of Jerusalem and the Temple. They believed there would be a new Heaven and new earth would be created by God at the end of time. They felt that the righteous will have glorified bodies and rise from their graves, so, too, will all of creation undergo a glorious renewal beyond the realm of imagination. The primary theme of Isaiah can be summarized as encompassing a more immanent image of God, every human person needs to be humbled before HIM. (CCC 1063, 1041-1050)

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: This short psalm shows the essence of prayer as an engaging conversation with God in which He reveals himself as one who is All-faithful and All-loving. This is a universal call to worship our Lord.

SECOND READING: The Chapter 12 in the book of Hebrews gives us some of the teachings of Jesus. He explains that a good parent disciplines his or her children out of love in an effort to form the children properly. In like manner, God allows trials in our lives so that our faith and virtues may increasingly mature. The Old law taught us to do God's will out of duty and fear; the New Law invites us to do God's will out of love. (CCC270,1709,2009,2520,2012)

GOSPEL: Luke explains that CHRIST invites everyone to be a part of the Kingdom of God. Therefore, salvation is no longer a birthright or privilege of the Chosen People alone. In spite of the long history of the Jewish people with the Scriptures and prophets, many Gentiles who embraced the message of repentance wholeheartedly will enter the Kingdom ahead of some of them. It remains to be important to bear in mind that the first ones to follow Christ were members of the Chosen People. (CCC 60, 72)

QUICK GRASP OF CATHOLIC FAITH: CANON LAW

SACRAMENT OF ORDERS: (Can. 1008-1054) Among the Christian faithful are made sacred ministers by means of the Sacrament of Orders. They are consecrated and deputed to nourish the people of God by performing the functions of teaching, sanctifying, and governing in the person of Christ. The three (3) orders are episcopate, presbyterate, and diaconate. They are conferred by the imposition of hands of the ordaining Bishop and the consecratory prayers prescribed in the liturgical books. The term "orders" comes from the Latin ordo, meaning an order, rank, class, or band, like a company of soldiers. Ordination means being incorporated into a group or order such as being in the college of bishops or presbyterium, as well as being commissioned for public ministry in the Church.

We have a great year planned with excited and knowledgeable Catechists, guest visitors, and special feast day celebrations along with good ol' Catechesis!

Since parents have given children their life, they are bound by the most serious obligation to educate their offspring and therefore must be recognized as the primary and principal educators. (11) This role in education is so important that only with difficulty can it be supplied where it is lacking. Parents are the ones who must create a family atmosphere animated by love and respect for God and man, in which the well-rounded personal and social education of children is fostered. Hence the family is the first school of the social virtues that every society needs. It is particularly in the Christian family, enriched by the grace and office of the sacrament of matrimony, that children should be taught from their early years to have a knowledge of God according to the faith received in Baptism, to worship Him, and to love their neighbor. Here, too, they find their first experience of a wholesome human society and of the Church. Finally, it is through the family that they are gradually led to a companionship with their fellowmen and with the people of God. Let parents, then, recognize the inestimable importance a truly

Christian family has for the life and progress of God's own people. (12) (GRAVISSIMUM EDUCATIONIS - Declaration On Christian Education, Blessed Pope Paul VI, 1968).

The Parish School of Religion program (formally known as CCD) was established to assist families in educating and forming children in the faith. Parents are the primary educators of their children and therefore must be constantly passing on the faith. It is not enough to only attend Mass, nor bring your children only during sacramental preparation years (unless providing faith formation at home), you as a parent are obligated to catechize your children. We are here to assist you with that obligation. Our program is open to all public, catholic or homeschool students. Faith formation does not stop with Confirmation; in fact, at this point it has only just begun because this is when your child begins to make it their own. When you make an effort to involve your children in parish activities, such as PSR, youth group, St. Maria Goretti friendship group, etc., it fosters a sense of community and forms a church family that will support them for years to come.
