



EDUCATIONAL CORNER

FIRST READING: The Israelites turned to the worship of the golden calf, God forgave them and remained faithful to them because of the intercessory prayer of Moses. We are all fortunate to still have such a God. HE stood in the breach between humanity and God, and in doing so provided a model that would inspire Israel's leaders for years to come. God had always been a just God, and now he began to manifest more clearly his unbounded forgiveness. (CCC 210,2112-2114,2577)

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: This is a prayer written by King David after Nathan the Prophet came to him after his affair with Bethsheba. That prayer gives a moving teaching on the destructive effects of sin and the requirement of a worthy repentance. Even for the most serious of sins, God stands ready to forgive the contrite heart. Fundamentally, every sin is an offence against God; in fact that is the very definition of sin. Sin is always a rejection of God's love.(CCC 298,431,1428,1850,2100)

SECOND READING: Our wonderful St. Paul recounted his own conversion from a persecutor of Christians to an Apostle for Christ. God often uses individuals with serious weaknesses so his power and presence might shine through all the more. Paul's own story of receiving mercy and forgiveness for his own terrible sins should lend hope to those who seek forgiveness for their own serious sins. Remember that FAITH IS A GIFT FROM GOD. (CCC 142, 545)

GOSPEL: Today, sharing a meal is a sign of friendship and so was it in the time of Jesus. We find Jesus invited to share a meal with tax collectors and sinners. The Pharisees were watching Jesus very carefully. They noted that Jesus was accepting the sinners. Jesus was well aware of this and he took the opportunity to show that his mission is to call sinners to repentance, for which there is more reason to rejoice than there is over those who have never strayed from the faith. Jesus Christ, the Good Shepherd, desires to call all his people together as one and to reconcile the wayward sinner back into the fold. (CCC 545)

QUICK GRASP OF CATHOLIC FAITH: CANON LAW

OTHER ACTS OF DIVINE WORSHIP: The Liturgy of the Hours (C. 1173 -1175) The Church, fulfilling the priestly function of Christ, celebrates the liturgy of the hours, whereby hearing God speaking to his people and memorializing the mystery of salvation, the Church praises Him in song and prayer without interruption and intercedes for the salvation of the whole world.

Other members of the Christian faithful according to circumstances are also earnestly invited to participate in the liturgy of the hours inasmuch as it is the action of the Church. In leading their lives, clerics are especially bound to pursue holiness because they are consecrated to God by a new title in the reception of order as dispensers of God's mysteries in the service of His people. (c276)
