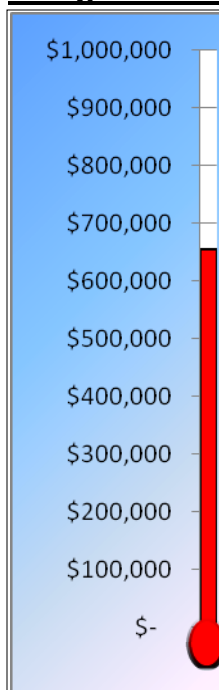

EDUCATIONAL CORNER

FIRST READING: We learned last week about Amos being one of the first "writer" prophets. His words contrast the wealth and luxurious lifestyles of a few with the multitude of downtrodden people in desperate need of the basic necessities for a dignified life. Wealth in itself is morally neutral. Riches are a source of evil, however, when used to satisfy greed and separate the heart from love of God and neighbor. Those blessed with an abundance of material resources are especially obligated to assist those less fortunate. (CCC 1723, 2552)

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: This beautiful psalm is praise to God for his help. This hymn of someone who has learned there is no other source of strength except the merciful God. It calls to mind God's works of salvation. As in other psalms, this one encourages every individual to put his or her trust in God over earthly powers. An essential part of counting on God's help and protection is to love him by keeping his Commandments. (CCC 150)

SECOND READING: Here we have St. Paul teaching Timothy. He urges him to lead a virtuous and holy life and to preach and defend the faith courageously. Those who are wealthy must be urged to be detached from riches and to stay focused on using their wealth for the good of others. God dwells in inapproachable light: God's divine life far transcends our human experience and capacity. He continues to desire to adopt us as his children and communicate this divine life to us. He provides us the opportunity to respond to his love for us through prayer and deeds of charity. (CCC 2145, 52)

GOSPEL: This Parable of the rich man and Lazarus is remarkable for its graphic imagery of the afterlife. It again illustrates Luke's concern with Jesus' attitude toward the rich and the poor. The reversal of the fates of the rich man and Lazarus illustrates the teachings of Jesus. (CCC 633, 1859, 2463, 2831)

QUICK GRASP OF CATHOLIC FAITH: CANON LAW

OTHER ACTS OF DIVINE WORSHIP: Sacred places are those that have been designated for divine worship or burial by liturgical dedication or blessing. There are five distinct areas that we need to cover. The Canon Laws are 1205 through 1241. We begin with #1 CHURCHES- Sacred buildings, intended for divine worship, to which the faithful have a right of access for purposes of public worship. #2 ORATORIES: Oratories are places set aside for a particular community or group of the faithful, like a religious community or those who are connected to a school or hospital to engage in divine worship. #3 SHRINES: Shrines are churches or other sacred places to which the faithful make pilgrimages. #4 ALTARS: Altars are the tables on which the Eucharistic sacrifice is celebrated. Every church should have a fixed altar (one attached to the floor) #5 CEMETERIES: The Church is to have its own cemeteries for the burial of the faithful departed, or space reserved for that purpose in civil cemeteries; both are to be blessed. Only those activities or events that serve the exercise or promotion of worship and religion are permitted in sacred places...anything not in keeping with the holiness of the place is forbidden.
