<u>FROM FATHER BEAN</u>: Five years ago, our parish was in the planning stages of building a new Parish Life Center to accommodate the demands of our growing community. The resulting facility was a tremendous success in meeting our needs; as well as providing a temporary location for daily and weekly masses during the pandemic and the constricting rules for Mass. In order to finance the Parish Life Center, we relied on your generosity through our building and brick campaigns. Although we had the cash available for more than half of the building project, we needed to finance a portion of the cost through the Diocese of Birmingham. As of the completion date in June 2017, we incurred a debt of \$762,800. During the subsequent 4-year period, I am happy to say that we have paid that debt down to \$365,000; less than half of where we started. Thank you to all who continue using the yellow Building Fund envelopes for that purpose.

Looking ahead, there are more projects in the planning stage:

As you know, we purchased a large section of land across the street from the Parish Life Center that will someday be used for the construction of a new church building. The details of this project are in the very early stages as it will be years into the future before we have the available resources to begin in earnest.
We also are planning to have our Parish Life Center parking lot paved with parking spaces lined. This will increase the parking capacity and help parishioners walk to the entrance door without stumbling on the stones.

 \cdot We are currently undertaking some minor renovations and upgrades to the old parish hall (Martin Hall), the sacristy and the kitchen and choir room behind the church as these areas are in use but in desperate need of some workand TLC (There is also the never-ending maintenance and repair needs of our much larger facilities!).

However, before we can fully tackle these ambitious plans, we need to seriously reduce our current debt to the Diocese. Therefore, I'm asking all our parishioners to prayerfully reflect on how they can help financially to immediately pay down our debt – either through greater monthly contributions with the Building Fund envelopes, or a special one-time donation for that expressed purpose. Thank you in advance for your generosity. I will continue to pray for each of you and for the future of our growing Parish. God bless you!
