

How to Explain and Defend Your Faith | Introductory Seminar March 22, 29, and April 5 | 6:30 - 8:00 PM with John Martignoni

Why do you Catholics call your priests, "father" when the Bible says "call no man on earth your father"? The Bible says Jesus had brothers and sisters, why does the Catholic Church teach He didn't? Where is Purgatory in the Bible? Why do you pray to Mary? Where is that in the Bible?

TREASURES OF THE CHURCH EXPOSITION

St. Theresa of the Child Jesus, Parish presents a teaching and exposition of Sacred Relics on Wednesday, March 30, 2022 at 6:30pm

Father Carlos Martins, a Vatican-appointed expert on relics will be here with an extraordinary Vatican collection of over 150 relics, some as old as 2,000 years. Among the treasures will be relics of St. Joseph, St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Faustina Kowalska.

There will also be a portion of the Veil of Our Lady and one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world. Those in attendance will be able to examine and venerate each relic. Throughout history, many healings have been worked in the presence of relics; and thousands have occurred through this ministry. You do not want to miss out!
