ASK A CATHOLIC

There is a basket located in the foyer, designated for questions about the Catholic Faith! Ask any question, and answers from John Martignoni, Kym Fach, and Father Bean will appear here in the bulletin!

Q: Why does St Theresa's not give out the Blood during Communion?

A: The Eucharist is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ. The Council of Trent (1545-63) affirmed that "Christ whole and entire, and a true Sacrament are received under either species." When one receives the Body of Christ, he also receives His Blood. When one receives the Blood of Christ, he also receives His Body. They cannot be separated.

Some churches do not offer the chalice for reasons of practicality: There aren't enough ministers (or extraordinary ministers) of Holy Communion, the congregation is too large, and the chalice is more easily spilled.

While reception under both species (bread and wine) is a fuller sign of the reality that is happening ("take and eat"; "take and drink"), there is no mandate by the Church for anyone other than the priest to receive under both forms, and no one is deprived of any grace by not receiving from the chalice, as Christ is received whole and entire under either.
